













DOME Empirical study


- Postal survey with possibility to answer anonymously on the web
- June-August 2012
- Mailed to 1000 patients, final sample N=354 (35,3 %)
 - Fully anonymous, no reminders or other tracking of the respondents
- Descriptive statistics and ANOVA (Tamhane's T2) in SPSS 21.0

DOME Questionnaire

- 1. Ordering a copy of the medical record: how, why, how many times?
- 2. Interest in online access and other e-Health services
- 3. Perceived benefits and threats of such services
- 4. Health information behaviour
- 5. Self-perceived health
- 6. Demographics
























DOME Comparisons and context

- Earlier findings on interest in reading medical records
 - Interest is low, ~0,4-4%
 - Data from USA, Denmark (1970s)
- The case of Uppsala
 - 11 000 copies ordered annually (-2012), \sim 300 000 patients (3,7%)
 - Current data shows that
 - 55 % first-timers
 - 19 % second-timers
 - 22 % recurrent readers
